 International Office: group consultation, Mobility-Online, administration of the Erasmus documents, Erasmus+ scholarship

• Erasmus coordinator at the Department: Application, Learning Agreement, recognition of the courses, information about the partner institutions

• Language center: Linguistic preparation



Studying abroad with Erasmus+ **First information**

Inform yourself in advance (about 1 Jahr before the start of your stay)!!

- Which institution is the right for me?
- When should I go abroad? (Bachelor or Master)? How long?
- Do the semester times fit?
- Which courses can I take?
- How does it work with the recognition of the courses?

Studying abroad with Erasmus+ Who can participate? When can I go?

- Erasmus+ stay possible from the im 3. Semester (Bachelor)
- Length of the stay abroad: 1 to 2 Semester max.12 months possible per study cycle
- You should be registered at University of Stuttgart during your whole stay
- No restrictions concerning your nationality
- "Best semester" for going abroad? No restrictions but it depends of your study degree

Studying abroad with Erasmus+ Tuition fees

- No tuition fees abroad
- You pay the fees at the University of Stuttgart
- Possibility to take a "leave of absence" under certain conditions

Studying abroad with Erasmus+ Language requirements

Basic rule: If the language of the courses = Englisch, min. B2 requested Other languages: min. B1

Examples:

- France: Englisch B2, French depending on the partner institution (max. B1)
- Norway: B2 Englisch
- Poland: B2 English
- Sweden: English B2
- Spain: B2 English, Spanish depending on the partner institution (max. B2)

Important: Information about language requirements on the website of the International Office of the host institution.

It is always advisable to attend a language course in the local language before going abroad!

Studying abroad with Erasmus+ Application: how does it look like?

- Priority list: <u>ERASMUS_Prioritaetenliste.pdf (uni-stuttgart.de)</u>
- Motivation letter
- CV
- Current transcript of records from C@mpus
- Proof of Language
- All files sent by email to the Erasmus+ coordinator of the first priority

Application deadlines:

January 15 for the next winter semester and/or Summer semester

June 15 (remaining places for the next summer semester)

Studying abroad with Erasmus+ Nomination of the candidates and follow-up

1) Selection at the Department

Selection criteria for the ranking of applicants:

- Academic performances
- Language skills
- Motivation
- Interests and activities in and around studies (commitment)

2) Nomination at International Office \rightarrow Nomination at host institution (by International Office)

3) Application at host university \rightarrow Acceptance at host institution

Intensiv support from the differents actors

You're not alone!! BUT... Engagement is required!!

Studying abroad with Erasmus+

Learning Agreement and recognition of the courses

Learning Agreement:

- Study contract between the student, the University of Stuttgart and the host institution
- Determines which modules can be completed at the host university and later recognized at the home university
- The Learning agreement lists all courses you take at the host institution
- At least 15 ECTS per Semester
- The Learning agreement can be modified on site

Recognition at the University of Stuttgart:

Determine which modules can be completed at the host university and later recognized at the home university

Studying abroad with Erasmus+ **Recognition of the courses**

- Possibility to have some courses you take abroad recognized at the University of Stuttgart
- Recognition is not mandatory!
- The LA determines which modules can be completed at the gast institution and later recognized at the home university
- Please contact the Erasmus* coordinator for more information = Coordinators will sign the LA

Internship abroad with Erasmus+

• Interships can be financially supported by Erasmus+ (about 150€ more per month than Erasmus+ for studies)

Requirements and deadlines:

- You have to find an internship at a company by yourself
- Only voluntary internship acceptable
- You are responsible for your insurances (not the University!)
- Application for Erasmus scholarship 4 weeks before
- Stay at least two months, at most 12 months
- Also possible after graduation
- Erasmus+ program internships organized by the HS Karlsruhe
